

- A concept is an inclusive or general idea formed by combining all of its characteristics.
- A principle is a fundamental rule of action used in deciding one's choice of conduct.
  - The Christian concept of morality is comprised of certain ethical principles such as the "golden rule" and the Ten Commandments.
  - The Babylonian concept of justice was characterized by the principle of retribution.
  - The concept of Westminster parliamentary democracy rests on the many principles inherent in British Common Law such as the rule of law, *Habeus corpus*, & the presumption of innocence.
