### WHAT IS MORALITY?

- Morality refers to that which might render an action right or wrong: "goodness" "rightness"
- The standard of moral conduct is determined by religious, cultural, or other societal beliefs
- Ex: The Ten Commandments
- Our laws are reflective of the values of the community

## POSITIVE LAW

- × Human-made laws
- Positivists believe that the standard of morality is subjective
- Positivists argue that the connection between law and morality is arbitrary
- Criminal law is ineffective and expensive way to impose moral values

## NATURAL LAW

- System of law that is determined by nature, and so is universal
- Argues that morality and the law are inextricably joined
- Naturalists believe that the law must be concerned about private matters as well as public

## **BANIA EL-ALLOUL**

- Quebec Judge Eliana Marengo refused to hear the case of a Muslim woman because she was wearing a hijab
- Judge Marengo cited Article 13 of the Court of Quebec that the courtroom is a secular place
- "hats and sunglasses for example, are not allowed. And I don't see why scarves on the head would be either...the same rules need to be applied to everyone"



# MORALITY AND LAW

- Article 13 of the regulations of the Court of Quebec states: "Any person appearing before the court must be suitably dressed"
- Not only is morality subjective, but laws are also open to interpretation



# NICCOLO MACHIAVELLI

- A philosopher who believed that virtue and morality are shaped by power.
- "The end justifies the means"
- "Politics have no relation to morals"
- "It is better to be feared than loved by the people"
